

*“Lift up your heads, O you gates! And be lifted up, you everlasting doors! And the King of glory shall come in” (Psalm 24:7).*

All heaven was waiting for the hour of triumph when Jesus should ascend to His Father. Angels came to receive the King of glory and to escort Him triumphantly to heaven. After Jesus had blessed His disciples, He was parted from them and taken up. And as He led the way upward, the multitude of captives who were raised at His resurrection followed. **THE AUTHOR OF THE BOOK**

**[This chapter is based on Revelation, Chapters 1 and 4]**

People everywhere have an inner longing for something they can worship. Augustine says that man was created with a vacuum that can be filled only by the presence of God! Perhaps most of us are not even aware of this longing! Psychologists tell us that people try to satisfy this inner longing by excessive eating, drinking, smoking, immorality, and materialism. But these things only bring temporary enjoyment.

The fragile bubbles people are chasing will burst, leaving a deeper void. What we really need to fill this inner void is a meaningful relationship with God — the God who has graphically revealed Himself in the Book of Revelation. We all need to feel the satisfaction of knowing there is someone more powerful than ourselves who is able and willing to help us solve all of our problems. We all need to know there is someone who unselfishly loves and cares for us!

In this lesson we will meet the Author of the book of Revelation — the God of the universe!

**1. Who is the real Author of the book of Revelation? Revelation 1:1, first part.**

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NOTE: You will find in some versions of the Bible that the translators have titled the book of Revelation, "The Revelation of St. John the Divine." In this they have contradicted the very first verse of the book itself! It is not only the Revelation of Jesus Christ, but it is the Revelation that God gave to Jesus, and Christ sent and signified it by His angel and told John to write it. So, you see, the real Author of Revelation is God, the Father — the Source of all wisdom and truth.

**2. Why did God give this Revelation to Jesus? Revelation 1:1.**

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**3. How is God described in this book? Revelation 1:4, 8.**

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**4. What members of the Godhead participated in the transmission of this message? Revelation 1:1, 4-6.**

NOTE: Here we find the phrase, “the seven spirits who are before His throne.” As we study further into the Book of Revelation, we will find numerous references to the number “seven.” The “sevens” denote fullness, completeness, or perfection.

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NOTE: They themselves declare that they were redeemed by the blood of the Lamb out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation (Revelation 5:8-10). They are, therefore, sinners saved by grace.

**9. What miraculous event occurred when Christ arose from the tomb? Matthew 27:50-53.**

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NOTE: When Jesus arose from the grave, the Bible says that graves were opened and many who slept in the graves arose — and when Jesus ascended to heaven, He took a multitude of captives with Him (Ephesians 4:8).

**10. What other beings did John see in God’s presence? Revelation 4:5-8.**

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NOTE: The word *beast* is from the Greek word, “zoa,” which actually means “living creatures,” or “living beings.” The quartet of living creatures that sing praises day and night unto the “Lord God Almighty,” which was, and is, and is to come” have the honor of being close to God. Is it any wonder they sing and praise Him day and night! Isaiah called these creatures seraphim (Isaiah 6:2). Ezekiel calls them cherubim (Ezekiel 10:15-20).

**11. What was the response of the 24 elders when the quartet sang their song of praise? Revelation 4:9, 10.**

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**12. Why do they say that God is worthy to be worshiped? Revelation 4:11.**

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NOTE: We find no atheists or evolutionists among the beings surrounding the throne of God! He is worthy of our praise and adoration! He made us and with His unlimited love has redeemed us!

**13. What question did David ask as he was considering this great universe God has created? Psalm 8:3, 4.**

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**14. What character trait of God causes Him to be concerned about us? I John 4:8, 16.**

**THE PLAN OF SALVATION  
(Continued)**

**The One Possible Way of Salvation**

The angels prostrated themselves before [Christ]. They offered their lives. Jesus said to them that He would by His death save many, that the life of an angel could not pay the debt. His life alone could be accepted of His Father as a ransom for man. Jesus also told them that they would have a part to act, to be with Him and at different times strengthen Him; that He would take man's fallen nature, and His strength would not be even equal with theirs; that they would be witnesses of His humiliation and great sufferings; and that as they would witness His sufferings and the hatred of men toward Him, they would be stirred with the deepest emotion, and through their love for Him would wish to rescue and deliver Him from His murderers; but that they must not interfere to prevent anything they should behold; and that they should act a part at His resurrection; that the plan of salvation was devised, and His Father had accepted the plan.

With a holy sadness Jesus comforted and cheered the angels and informed them that hereafter those whom He should redeem would be with Him, and that by His death He should ransom many and destroy him who had the power of death. And His Father would give Him the kingdom and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, and He would possess it forever and ever. Satan and sinners would be destroyed, nevermore to disturb heaven or the purified new earth. Jesus bade the heavenly host be reconciled to the plan that His Father had accepted and rejoice that through His death fallen man could again be exalted to obtain favor with God and enjoy heaven.

Then joy, inexpressible joy, filled heaven. And the heavenly host sang a song of praise and adoration. They touched their harps and sang a note higher than they had done before, for the great mercy and condescension of God in yielding up His dearly Beloved to die for a race of rebels. Praise and adoration were poured forth for the self-denial and sacrifice of Jesus; that He would consent to leave the bosom of His Father and choose a life of suffering and anguish, and die an humiliating death to give life to others.

Think ye that the Father yielded up His dearly beloved Son without

a struggle? No, no. It was even a struggle with the God of heaven, whether to let guilty man perish, or to give His beloved Son to die for him. Angels were so interested for man's salvation that there could be found among them those who would yield their glory and give their life for perishing man, but, that would avail nothing. The transgression was so great that an angel's life would not pay the debt. Nothing but the death and intercession of His Son would pay the debt and save lost man from hopeless sorrow and misery."

But the work of the angels was assigned them, to ascend and descend with strengthening balm from glory to soothe the Son of God in His sufferings and minister unto Him. Also, their work would be to guard and keep the subjects of grace from the evil angels and the darkness constantly thrown around them by Satan. It was impossible for God to alter or change His law to save lost, perishing man; therefore He suffered His beloved Son to die for man's transgression.

Satan again rejoiced with his angels that he could, by causing man's fall, pull down the Son of God from His exalted position. He told his angels that when Jesus should take fallen man's nature, he could overpower Him and hinder the accomplishment of the plan of salvation.

Satan once was a happy, exalted angel. He still bears a kingly form. His features are still noble, for he is an angel, fallen. But the expression of his countenance is full of anxiety, care, unhappiness, malice, hate, mischief, deceit, and every evil. That brow that was once so noble [was changed]. His forehead commenced from his eyes to recede. He had so long bent himself to evil that every good quality was debased, and every evil trait was developed. His eyes were cunning, sly, and showed great penetration. His frame was large, but the flesh hung loosely about his hands and face. As I beheld him, his chin was resting upon his left hand. He appeared to be in deep thought. A smile was upon his countenance; it was so full of evil and satanic slyness. This smile is the one he wears just before he makes sure of his victim, and as he fastens the victim in his snare, this smile grows horrible.

In humility and inexpressible sadness Adam and Eve left the lovely garden wherein they had been so happy until they disobeyed the command of God. The atmosphere was changed. It was no longer unvarying as before the transgression. God clothed them with coats of skins



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to protect them from the sense of chilliness and then of heat to which they were exposed.

### **God's Unchangeable Law**

All heaven mourned on account of the disobedience and fall of Adam and Eve, which brought the wrath of God upon the whole human race. They were cut off from communing with God and were plunged in hopeless misery. The law of God could not be changed to meet man's necessity, for in God's arrangement it was never to lose its force nor give up the smallest part of its claims.

The angels of God were commissioned to visit the fallen pair and inform them that although they could no longer retain possession of their holy estate, their Eden home, because of their transgression of the law of God, yet their case was not altogether hopeless. They were then informed that the Son of God, who had conversed with them in Eden, had been moved with pity as He viewed their hopeless condition, and had volunteered to take upon Himself the punishment due to them, and die for them that man might yet live, through faith in the atonement Christ proposed to make for him. Through Christ a door of hope was opened, that man, notwithstanding his great sin, should not be under the absolute control of Satan. Faith in the merits of the Son of God would so elevate man that he could resist the devices of Satan. Probation would be granted him in which, through a life of repentance and faith in the atonement of the Son of God, he might be redeemed from his transgression of the Father's law, and thus be elevated to a position where his efforts to keep His law could be accepted.

The angels related to them the grief that was felt in heaven as it was announced that they had transgressed the law of God, which had made it expedient for Christ to make the great sacrifice of His own precious life.

When Adam and Eve realized how exalted and sacred was the law of God, the transgression of which made so costly a sacrifice necessary to save them and their posterity from utter ruin, they pleaded to die themselves, or to let them and their posterity endure the penalty of their transgression, rather than that the beloved Son of God should make this great sacrifice. The anguish of Adam was increased. He saw that his sins were of so great magnitude as to involve fearful consequences. And must it be that heaven's honored Commander, who had walked with him and talked with him while in his holy innocence, whom angels honored and worshiped, must be brought down from his exalted position to die because of his transgression?

Adam was informed that an angel's life could not pay the debt. The law of Jehovah, the foundation of His government in heaven and upon earth, was as sacred as God Himself; and for this reason the life of an angel could not be accepted of God as a sacrifice for its transgression. His law is of more importance in His sight than the holy angels around His throne. The

could not abolish or change one precept of His law to meet man in his fallen condition. But the Son of God, who had in unison with the Father created man, could make an atonement for man acceptable to God, by giving His life a sacrifice and bearing the wrath of His Father. Angels informed Adam that, as his transgression had brought death and wretchedness, life and immortality would be brought to light through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

### **A View of the Future**

To Adam were revealed future important events, from his expulsion from Eden to the Flood, and onward to the first advent of Christ upon the earth; His love for Adam and his posterity would lead the Son of God to condescend to take human nature, and thus elevate, through His own humiliation, all who would believe on Him. Such a sacrifice was of sufficient value to save the whole world; but only a few would avail themselves of the salvation brought to them through such a wonderful sacrifice. Many would not comply with the conditions required of them that they might be partakers of His great salvation. They would prefer sin and transgression of the law of God rather than repentance and obedience, relying by faith upon the merits of the sacrifice offered. This sacrifice was of such infinite value as to make a man who should avail himself of it more precious than fine gold.

Adam was carried down through successive generations and saw the increase of crime, of guilt and defilement, because man would yield to his naturally strong inclinations to transgress the holy law of God. He was shown that iniquity and violence would steadily increase; yet amid all the tide of human misery and woe, there would ever be a few who would preserve the knowledge of God and would remain unsullied amid the prevailing moral degeneracy. Adam was made to comprehend what sin is — the transgression of the law. He was shown that moral, mental, and physical degeneracy would result to the race, from transgression, until the world would be filled with human misery of every type.

The days of man were shortened by his own course of sin in transgressing the righteous law of God. The race was finally so greatly depreciated that they appeared inferior and almost valueless. They were generally incompetent to appreciate the mystery of Calvary, the grand and elevated facts of the atonement, and the plan of salvation, because of the indulgence of the carnal mind. Yet, notwithstanding the weakness, and enfeebled mental, moral, and physical powers of the human race, Christ, true to the purpose for which He left heaven, continues His interest in the feeble, depreciated, degenerate specimens of humanity, and invites them to hide their weakness and great deficiencies in Him. If they will come unto Him, He will supply all their needs.

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NOTE: God loves us when we are good and when we are bad. He loves us if we are beautiful or if we are ugly. He loves us if we are black, white, brown, red, or yellow. In fact, He said He loves us with an “everlasting love” (Jeremiah 31:3). There’s no one else like that!

**15. How did God show His great love for us? John 3:16.**

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NOTE: God gave His Son to a fallen race — a planet in rebellion! Christ died that we could live eternally. He suffered without protest! He could have called 10,000 angels to set Himself free, but He couldn’t save Himself and save us too! This was the ultimate gift of a loving, caring God for guilty man. And as His bruised and bleeding body hung on the cross, Jesus prayed, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do” (Luke 23:34). That’s what God is like!

**16. What did Jesus tell us to call God? Matthew 6:9.**

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**17. What touching example of human love did God use to let us know about His everlasting love for us? Isaiah 49: 15, 16.**

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**18. What is the ultimate goal that God has for each of us? Revelation 21:6, 7; John 1:12; II Peter 3:9.**

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**19. When will God’s plan for mankind finally be realized? Revelation 21:1-3.**

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NOTE: In this lesson we have discovered the real Author of the book of Revelation. What a God! It is difficult for human minds to fathom such love!

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
### Does the phrase "unquenchable fire" mean that the fires of hell will never go out?

*"He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire" (Matthew 3:12b).*

An unquenchable fire is a fire that cannot be put out. Once it begins its work, nothing can stop it. Likewise, when the fires of hell begin, no amount of water can extinguish the flames. The question really to be asked is, "Will it ever go out?" Yes, of course — when its work is done. When sin and sinners are consumed, the fires will quit. Isaiah 47:14 describes this work as ending in "stubble." After the fires of hell have done their work of destruction, the flames will go out.

The "fire" mentioned in Matthew 3 speaks of the punishment of the wicked. Since God is described in the Bible as a consuming fire (Deuteronomy 4:24), sin cannot exist in His presence. It is consumed and destroyed. And so at the end of time, when we all have made our final choice to either accept or reject the Lord, His glorious coming to this earth will certainly destroy and consume sinners who refuse to let go of sin.

Matthew 3:10-12 presents two classes of people — the saved and the lost. Verse 10 compares the lost as a tree that does not bear fruit and is cast into a fire and consumed. Verse 12 describes sinners as chaff that will "burn up." Like a refiner's fire, the sin in our lives will either be burned up — or it will burn us up with it if we are unwilling to release it to God. — D.B.

### Oxygen for Ministry

Flight attendants instruct airplane passengers that if oxygen masks are needed, we should secure our own before assisting someone else. Why? If we aren't getting enough oxygen ourselves, we can't help another person for long.

Opening ourselves to the Spirit in these ways allows the Breath of God to flow into us, which in turn empowers us to reach out to others in love.
